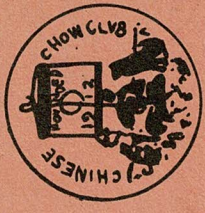

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. This show will be held under Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations. Entries must be made on or before Wednesday 18th December, 1974 (postmark)
2. The Show opens at 11.00 a.m. Judging will commence at 12.00 noon. Show closes at 5.00 p.m.
3. All dogs must be at the Show by 12.00 noon on Saturday, 18th January, 1975, except through very exceptional circumstances and by special permission of the Show Manager which may be granted up to 2.30 p.m. at the Exhibitor's own risk. All charges by rail to be prepaid by the Exhibitor.
4. Admission to non-exhibitors 25p. Accompanied children 10p. Catalogue 25p.
5. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs or Dog World of any alterations or addition made to the Schedule or in these Regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.
6. Every exhibitor making an entry or entries for or at this Show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations and by these Regulations and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.
7. All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club before the Show (vide Kennel Club Rule 5).
8. Puppies under 6 calendar months of age are not eligible for exhibition. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(Vide Kennel Club Regulations for Definitions of Classes)

The word "dog" includes both sexes.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' Classes or competing for Members' Specials, each member of such partnership must, at the time of entry, be a member of such Association, Club or Society.

In estimating the number of prizes won, all wins previous to the midnight preceding the day specified in the Schedule for closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A Variety Class is one in which more than one breed can compete. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

Note In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

With these provisos the following are the Definitions of certain classes:-

- Puppy For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.
Junior For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.
Novice For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Puppy and Minor Puppy classes excepted).
Special Novice Same as Novice but restricted as to colour.
Graduate For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.
Post Graduate For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes, whether restricted or not.
Limit For dogs which have won three Challenge Certificates under three different judges or seven or more First Prizes in all, at Championship Shows in Limit and Open Classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

Special Open Same as Open but restricted as to colour.
Open For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.
Junior Handling Ages as stated. Judged on handling alone.

Challenge Basket, re-presented by the late Mrs. Manooch for Best Dog bred by Exhibitor, 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners only eligible to compete (perpetual).
Ch. You Si Bowl, re-presented by Mrs. T.J. Painting for Best Blue Dog in Show. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners only eligible to compete. This Trophy is now perpetual.
The Adel Cup presented by the late Miss Buckley for Best Bitch any other colour than Red, bred by exhibitor. 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners only eligible to compete. To be won five times by the same exhibitor.
Akbar Cup, presented by Miss Peck for Best Puppy Dog or Bitch bred by exhibitor. To be won three times in succession or five times in all by same owner. (1st, 2nd and 3rd prize winners only).
Chinese Challenge Cup, presented by the Chinese Chow Club for Best Dog any other colour than Red. To be won five times by the same exhibitor.
Chinese Challenge Cup, presented by the Chinese Chow Club for Best Bitch any other colour than Red. To be won five times by the same exhibitor.
Cup, presented by Miss Faudel-Phillips for Best Junior Dog or Bitch. To be won three times by same exhibitor.
Cup, presented by the Countess of Kilmorey for Best Black Bitch.
Cup, presented by the late Miss Buckley for Best Smooth Chow Dog. To be won five years in succession or five times in all, not more than twice by the same animal.
Cup, presented by the late Mrs. Shacklock for Best Smooth Chow bitch. To be won three years in succession or five times in all, not more than twice by the same animal. Re-presented by Mr. & Mrs. Burrows as a perpetual trophy.

EXTRACT FROM KENNEL CLUB SHOW REGULATIONS
Jan 1971

2. All dogs exhibited at this show must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with the provisions of Kennel Club Rule 5. Forms for this purpose will be supplied on application to the Secretary, Kennel Club, 1, Clarges St, Piccadilly, LONDON, W1Y 8AB.
3. Payment of prize money will be made in accordance with the provisions of Kennel Club Show Regulation 33 not later than 31 days from the close of a Show.
4. Any objections to dogs must be made in accordance with the provisions of Kennel Club Show Regulations 27 and 28, and will be dealt with in strict conformity with that rule.
5. Disqualification and forfeiture of prizes.- A dog may be disqualified by the Committee of the Kennel Club from winning any award whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved among other things to have been:
- a) Exhibited at an unrecognised show.
 - b) Exhibited by a person disqualified or suspended under Rules 15, 17, or 18 as from the date of the charge having been lodged at the Kennel Club and for the period of the disqualification or suspension.
 - c) Not entered on the entry form for the show in the name and with the details which are recorded with the Kennel Club.
 - d) Entered after the date fixed for closing entries or in a manner not complying with the Classification in the Schedule, or not in accordance with Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
 - e) (i) Totally blind; (ii) defective in hearing; (iii) prevented from breeding as a result of a surgical operation except as provided for in Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. This shall not apply to a bitch which has progeny registered at the Kennel Club.
 - f) Suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, or prepared for exhibition in contravention of Regulations.
 - g) Exhibited for competition or handled in the ring by a Judge of dogs on the same day of the Show, except that this shall not apply where a Judge is appointed in an emergency.
 - h) Exhibited for competition or handled in the ring by a Judge of Groups or Best in Show at that Show.
 - i) Owned by the Judge within a period of twelve months or, if a puppy bred by him, except that this shall not apply to a substituted Judge, if the Judge of the breed be changed after the closing of entries.
 - j) Handled at a Show, boarded or given attention within twelve months by the scheduled Judge of the breed of the Show.
 - k) Absent from its bench contrary to the provisions of Regulations 19(a) and (b).
 - l) Not duly registered or transferred to the provisions of Regulations 19(a) and (b).
 - m) The progeny resulting from the artificial fertilization of a bitch, unless prior permission was obtained from the Committee of the Kennel Club, and such conditions were complied with as it considered advisable to prevent the possibility of fraud.
- If a dog is entered in a Class for which it is ineligible and is not withdrawn from competition before commencement of the judging of the Class in question, the dog shall be disqualified. All such cases must be reported by the Exhibitor to the Show Secretary, and by the latter to the Kennel Club, and the Exhibitor may be fined at the discretion of the Committee of the Kennel Club.

The owner of a dog disqualified for any of the above reasons is liable to forfeit all entry fees made for, and all prize money won by, such dog. The Committee of the Kennel Club shall have power to inflict fines upon Exhibitors who shall have made errors in their entry forms, or breaches of Show Regulations.

In the event of such fines not being paid within the time stipulated by the Committee, the Exhibitor or Exhibitors may, at the discretion of the Committee, be dealt with as if a complaint under Kennel Club Rule 17 had been lodged against him or them and proved to the satisfaction of the Committee.

6. All entries must be made on the entry form enclosed with this Schedule; they must be written entirely in ink or indelible pencil; only one exhibitor shall enter on one form.

7. Dogs for exhibition at this Show must be prepared for show only in the manner prescribed by Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

8. A copy of the K.C. Rules and Regulations as supplied by the Kennel Club, must be accessible at the show to every exhibitor.

9. No dog under six months of age can be exhibited.

10. No person may interfere in any way with the benching as erected in accordance with Regulation 18 of the Kennel Club Show Regulations, and in particular the partitions as erected between one pen and another must not be removed under any circumstances. Printed cards "For Sale" and "Not for Competition" may be placed over the benches, and in the case of a dog entered "Not for Competition" the name of the dog must also be displayed, but in no case may the

lettering be larger than 1 inch. Exhibitors may display a board or card over their benches containing the name of the kennel, the name and address of the owner of the kennel, the telephone number, but no other information whatsoever. The size of the board must not exceed 10 ins. by 5 ins. and the lettering must be black on a white background and must not be larger than 1 in.

11. No dog shall be absent from its bench except for the purpose of being prepared for exhibition, judged, exercised or by order of the Veterinary Surgeon or Show Committee. After being prepared for exhibition, the dog must be replaced on its bench. No dog shall be absent from its bench for the purpose of being exercised at any time for longer than fifteen minutes.

No dog shall be allowed in a judging ring other than the actual exhibits in the class being judged. All dogs when off their benches must be on a lead throughout the duration of the Show except in the exercising area, when provided, or when competing in the ring in an Obedience Test.

Prize Cards, Award Cards or Rosettes may be displayed on the bench, but not in the ring. Committee the Sole Authority. - The Committee shall be the sole authority for the

interpretation of these Rules and of the By-Laws and Regulations made thereunder; and the decision of the Committee upon any question of interpretation or upon any matter affecting the Club or dogs or Dog Shows and not provided for by these Rules or by the Constitution and By-Laws or any Regulations shall be final and binding. A person attending or entering a dog for any Show shall by such act be deemed to have agreed with the Committee to refer any such question or dispute to the Committee.
