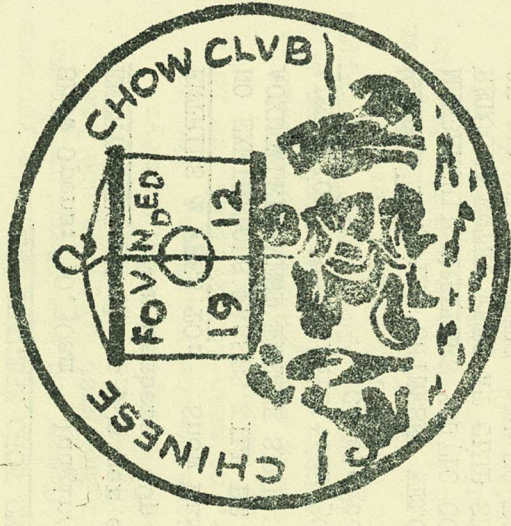

the dog show world all her life. For the past 20 years she has
been seen in the ring showing her mother's and her own CHANOYU
chows, having handled both her mother's Champions - Ch.Chanoyu
Golden Gem and Ch.Chanoyu Golden Marcus to their titles. She has
bred only one litter in her own name, no mean achievement for in
that was a black bitch puppy to become famous as Ch.Chanoyu
Christmas Carol of Nitram. Other winning dogs which she herself

SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

This Show will be held under K.C. Rules and Show Regulations. Entries must be made on or before Monday 9th July 1979. First Class Post advisable
The Show opens at 10.30am. Judging commences 11.00am. Show closes 3.30pm. Early removal 2.30pm over 100 miles.
All dogs must be at the show by 11.00am on Sunday 5th August 79 except through very exceptional circumstances and by permission of the Show Manager which may be granted up to 11.30am at the exhibitors own risk. All charges by rail to be prepaid by the exhibitor.

Admission to non-exhibitors 30p. Accompanied Children 15p Catalogue 30p.

An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in OUR DOGS or DOG WORLD of any alteration or addition to the Schedule or in these regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.

Every exhibitor making an entry or entries for or at this show shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by Kennel Club Rules & Show Regs. and it is on this understanding only that entries are received.

All dogs must be registered or transferred at the Kennel Club before the show (Vide Rule 5)

Puppies under 6 months of age are not eligible for exhibition. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is strictly forbidden.

DEFINITION OF CLASSES

please give RAF (Registration applied for) or NAF or TAF below the dogs name on the entry form if not yet returned from the K.C. The dog owned in partnership and entered in Members classes or competing for Members special dog included in Members classes must, at the time of entry, be a member of this Club. In estimating the number of prizes won, all wins up to and including the 7th day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class. (1st July). Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A Variety class is one in which more than one breed or variety of breed can compete. Wins at Championship Shows in all classes where C.C.'s are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. NOTE In the following definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

MINOR PUPPY for dogs of 6 and not exceeding 9 calendar months of age on day of show

PUPPY for dogs of 6 and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on day of show

JUNIOR for dogs of 6 and not exceeding 18 calendar months of age on day of show

NOVICE for dogs which have not won a C.C. or 3 or more 1st prizes at Open & Championship Shows (Sp. Puppy, Puppy, Minor & Sp. Minor Puppy classes excepted)

GRADUATE for dogs which have not won a C.C. or 4 or more 1st prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Postgraduate, Minor Limit & Open classes whether restricted or not.

MID LIMIT & OPEN classes but restricted as to Colour

SPECIAL GRADUATE as Graduate but restricted as to Colour

LIMIT for dogs which have not won 3 C.C.'s under 3 different judgements or 7 or more 1st prizes in all at Championship shows in Limited & Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where C.C.'s were offered for the breed.

OPEN for all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided eligible for entry at the show.

SPECIAL OPEN as for Open but restricted as to Colour

VETERAN for dogs of 8 years or over on day of show

SPECIAL BEGINNERS Owner, handler or dog never to have won a C.C. in the breed. or Reserve C.C. in the breed.
